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Theme Verses of Romans:

¹⁶I am not ashamed of the gospel, <u>for</u> it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

¹⁷For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "But the righteous by faith will live."

II. 1:18—3:20_____GOD'S WRATH REVEALED AGAINST SINFUL HUMANS: THE NEED FOR JUSTIFICATION (Problems of Sin and Wrath)

1:18-32	God's Wrath Against Unrighteous Men (Gentiles) Who Approve of Depravity
1:18-20	They Are Without Excuse—They Rejected the Revelation of God in Creation
1:21-23	They Did Not Honor Their Creator, But Worshiped Images of Created Things
1:24-31	God's Judgment—He Let Their Increasing Wickedness Harm Them
1:24-25	Lustful impurity caused their bodies to be dishonored
1:26-27	Homosexual passions degraded and harmed them
1:28-31	Depraved thinking led to all kinds of improper deeds
1:32	They Know God Says They Deserve Death, Yet Approve Others Like Themselves
2:1-16	God's Wrath Against Unrighteous Men (Gentiles/Jews) Who Judge Others
2:1-4	They Are Without Excuse—They Do the Same as Those They Judge
2:5-16	God's Coming Day of Wrath—All Will Be Judged According to Their Deeds
2:5-11	God is impartial—Jews and Gentiles will both be judged by their deeds
2:12-16	God is impartial—Jews and Gentiles will each be judged by the Law they know
2:17—3:20	God's Wrath Against the Jews
2:17-29	Jews Are Without Excuse—They Don't Keep the Law
2:17-24	Having the Law doesn't save Law-breakers
2:25-29	Being circumcised doesn't save Law-breakers (25-27),
	but "heart circumcision" by the Spirit makes one a true Jew (28-29).
3:1-8	Questions about God's Justice
3:9-20	Summary: The Whole World—Jews Included—Is Sinful and Accountable to God
3:9	Jews are no better than Gentiles; both are sinful
3:10-18	Evidence from the Law of human (especially Jewish) sinfulness
3:19-20	Conclusion: The Law proves all are guilty and will save no one

	3:21-24	It Is Given, through Christ's Faithfulness, to All Who Believe—Justification
	3:25-26	It Is Shown, in Christ's Death, by God No Longer Overlooking Sin-Justice

<u>Law court</u> – "justification"






Marketplace - "redemption"




<u>Jewish temple</u> – "atonement/propitiation"

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
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4:1-25	Evidence from the Law: Abraham Was Justified by Faith—So Are We
4:1-8	Introduction: "Faith was credited to Abraham as righteousness"
4:9-12	Abraham was given righteousness through faith, not circumcision
4:13-17	Abraham was given the promise through faith, not the Law



What is saving faith fully convinced about?

[Righteousness] will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

(Romans 4:24-25, ESV).

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- 1. God—He keeps his promises.
- 2. God has provided the way that I can become righteous.
 - → I have done bad deeds.
 - → My deeds matter; bad deeds are deadly.
 - → Apart from Christ, I am not in right standing with God.
 - → Apart from Christ, I will receive God's wrath.
 - → Jesus died: His death is God's plan for dealing with my sins.
 - → Jesus rose: His resurrection is God's way to give me right standing with Him.
 - → Jesus is my Lord—master, boss, ruler—possessing all power and authority, and deserving all my obedience.

	In Christ All Will Live, Just as in Adam All Die
5:12	Just as Adam's Evil Deed Brought Sin and Death to All Men
5:13-17	(Clarifications and Contrasts)
5:13-14	Sin and death existed even before the Law made men guilty
5:15-17	Contrasts between Adam's trespass and Christ's gift
5:18-19	So Christ's Righteous Deed Brought Righteousness and Eternal Life to All Men
5:20-21	The Law Made Sin Increase, But Grace Increased Even More Through Christ

How does Adam's sin affect us?

5:12—5:21	B – Justification = No Condemnation:
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How does Adam's sin affect us?

Yes

- 1. Presence of sin
- 2. Loss of innocence
- 3. Physical death

Secondarily...
In this "climate" of sin,
we all sin and
face God's wrath.

No

- 1. Guilt for Adam's sin
- 2. Punishment for Adam's sin
- 3. Irreparable bondage to sin

"Original righteousness":
Christ frees us more
certainly and completely
than Adam left us bound!

7:7-25	C' – The Law Is Not Sinful; But It Cannot Free from Sin and Death
7:7-12	Is the Law Sinful, Since It Awakens Sin? No, It Convicts of Sin and Is Holy
7:13-25	Does the Law Cause Our Death? No, Sin Does. The Law Drives Us to Christ
7:13	Sin is shown to be utterly sinful because it uses the good Law to kill us
7:14-23	Our inability to keep the Law reveals sin is inside our flesh, binding us
7:24-25a	The resulting wretchedness drives us to Christ, who frees us from death
7:25b	Conclusion: With your mind serve the Law of God, or with your flesh the law of sin

8:1—17	B' – Justification → Sanctification = No Condemnation:
	By the Spirit You Will Live, Just as by the Flesh You Die
8:1-8	The Spirit Frees Those in Christ from Sin and Condemnation
8:1-2	Thesis: We face no condemnation, for the Spirit frees from the law of sin and death
8:3-4	How? In Christ's sacrifice, God condemned sin, so the Law can be fulfilled in us
8:5-8	For those in the Spirit (not the flesh) set their minds on what pleases God.
8:9-17_	The Spirit Gives Life and Testifies We Are Children of God—Follow His Leading!
8:9-11	Fact: All who belong to God have the Spirit, giving us life
8:12-14	Response: We owe it to the Spirit to let him (not death-producing flesh) lead us
8:15-17	Fact: The Spirit assures our spirits we are children of God destined for glory
