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Theme Verses of Romans:

¹⁶I am not ashamed of the gospel, <u>for</u> it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

¹⁷For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "But the righteous by faith will live."

(Romans 1:16-17, NASB adapted)

What is saving faith fully convinced about?

[Righteousness] will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

(Romans 4:24-25, ESV).

- 1. God—He keeps his promises.
- 2. God has provided the way that I can become righteous.
 - → I have done bad deeds.
 - → My deeds matter; bad deeds are deadly.
 - → Apart from Christ, I am not in right standing with God.
 - → Apart from Christ, I will receive God's wrath.
 - → Jesus died: His death is God's plan for dealing with my sins.
 - → Jesus rose: His resurrection is God's way to give me right standing with Him.
 - → Jesus is my Lord—master, boss, ruler—possessing all power and authority, and deserving all my obedience.

5:3-4	Joy in suffering, which only increases our hope
5:5-8	Because of the Love That God Has Already:
5:5	1) Poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit;
5:6-8	Shown when Christ died for us while we were still sinners.
5:9-11	If God Loved His Enemies, He Will Certainly Spare His Friends

Past

- Justified by faith
 - Began in grace
- God's love poured within our hearts
- Gift of Holy Spirit
 - Christ died for the ungodly
- God demonstrated His love
 - Jesus died for God's enemies

5:12—5:21	B – Justification = No Condemnation:
	In Christ All Will Live, Just as in Adam All Die
5:12	Just as Adam's Evil Deed Brought Sin and Death to All Men
5:13-17	(Clarifications and Contrasts)
5:13-14	Sin and death existed even before the Law made men guilty
5:15-17	Contrasts between Adam's trespass and Christ's gift
5:18-19	So Christ's Righteous Deed Brought Righteousness and Eternal Life to All Men
5:20-21	The Law Made Sin Increase, But Grace Increased Even More Through Christ

How does Adam's sin affect us?

Yes

- 1. Presence of sin
- 2. Loss of innocence
- 3. Physical death

Secondarily...
In this "climate" of sin,
we all sin and
face God's wrath.

- 1. Guilt for Adam's sin
- 2. Punishment for Adam's sin
- 3. Irreparable bondage to sin

"Original righteousness":
Christ frees us more
certainly and completely
than Adam left us bound!

6:1-23—7:6	C – Grace Does Not Lead to Sin; It Frees from Sin and Death
6:1-14	A New You – Sin Has No Dominion over Us Who Died and Rose with Christ
6:1-4	Grace is not a reason to sin, for we been baptized into Jesus' death and life
6:5-7	We know that: In Christ, our old sinful self has died, freeing us from sin
6:8-11	We know that: Like Christ, having died once to sin, we can forever live to God
6:12-14	Since you have been freed from sin's reign, don't volunteer to serve it
6:15-23	A New Master - Sin's Wages Cannot Match Righteousness's Gift
6:15-19	Grace is not a reason to sin, for you have become slaves who obey God
6:20-23	Sin pays with death; God gives sanctification which leads to eternal life
7:1-6	A New Husband - Sin Bears Fruit Only in the Law's Bride, Not in Christ's Bride
7:1-3	Marriage analogy: Death removes one from the bondage of the law
7:4-6	Our death to the Law means our new "husband," Christ, can bear fruit in us

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A New Master = We see no benefit in sinning

A New Husband = We are not "impregnated" with sinful desires

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Himself as an unsaved Jew?

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Paul is describing the Law—its nature and effects!

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"It is not the hearers of the Law who are just before God, but the doers of the Law will be justified" (2:13). "By the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin. But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested" (3:20-21). "We maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from the works of the Law" (3:28). "If those who are of the Law are heirs... the promise is nullified; for the Law brings about wrath, but where there is no law, there also is no violation" (4:14-15). "The Law came in so that the transgression would increase" (5:20). "Sin shall not be master over you, for you are not under law but under grace" (6:14). "You were made to die to the Law through the body of Christ" (7:4). "The sinful passions... were aroused by the Law... to bear fruit for death" (7:5).

7:7-25	C' – The Law Is Not Sinful; But It Cannot Free from Sin and Death
7:7-12	Is the Law Sinful, Since It Awakens Sin? No, It Convicts of Sin and Is Holy
7:13-25	Does the Law Cause Our Death? No, Sin Does. The Law Drives Us to Christ
7:13	Sin is shown to be utterly sinful because it uses the good Law to kill us

8:1-8	The Spirit Frees Those in Christ from Sin and Condemnation
8:1-2	Thesis: We face no condemnation, for the Spirit frees from the law of sin and death
8:3-4	How? In Christ's sacrifice, God condemned sin, so the Law can be fulfilled in us
8:5-8	For those in the Spirit (not the flesh) set their minds on what pleases God.
8:9-17	The Spirit Gives Life and Testifies We Are Children of God—Follow His Leading!
8:9-11	Fact: All who belong to God have the Spirit, giving us life
8:12-14	Response: We owe it to the Spirit to let him (not death-producing flesh) lead us

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



8:3-4	How? In Christ's sacrifice, God condemned sin, so the Law can be fulfilled in us
8:5-8	For those in the Spirit (not the flesh) set their minds on what pleases God.
8:9-17	The Spirit Gives Life and Testifies We Are Children of God—Follow His Leading!
8:9-11	Fact: All who belong to God have the Spirit, giving us life
8:12-14	Response: We owe it to the Spirit to let him (not death-producing flesh) lead us
8:15-17	Fact: The Spirit assures our spirits we are children of God destined for glory



8:18-30	God's Purpose for His Children: Groaning Will Give Birth to Glory
8:18	Thesis: Present suffering fades before the coming glory of God's children
8:19-22	1) Creation groans—longing to escape futility and share our coming glory
8:23-25	2) We groan—waiting eagerly for the redemption of our bodies
8:26-27	3) The Spirit groans—interceding for us according to the purposes of God
8:28-30	Conclusion: God's purpose is to use all things to glorify us as children of God
8:31-39	Conclusion: God Is for Us, His Elect—Nothing Can Change That!
